- With regards to the Acceptable Use Policy(AUP), would like to make sure that programs that are used on social media to teach students to market themselves are accessible.
- AUP has been the subject of much scrutiny and conversation. Filters have already been applied due to state law.
- District owned devices have local content filter that have to abide by the state law.
- If someone is on the district network, regardless of what device they are using, district or personal, they will be blocked by the firewall preventing access to websites deemed inappropriate by the state.
- The district has no control over a personal device when a student is home using their own Wi-Fi, but if they take the district device and use their personal Wi-Fi, it is still subject to the same filtering rules per state law.
- Online content for educational purposes.
- There is a process for teachers to use regarding online content for educational purposes. Online program WordPress.
- IT is working closely with the Career Technical Education (CTE) Department to find solutions to online issues.
- This policy is based on state Board of Education Rule 6A-1.0957.
- The district has no control over a personal device for as long as it is not connected to the district's network.

- The new Executive Director of Policy and Compliance will be starting in December.
- There are times when clarification and guidance is provided to principals.
- Concern about the impact on the people wanting to volunteer.
- Board Policy 9.63 can be brought back for policy review.
