Paula Renfro, Chief Officer of Academics shared with the Board Members information regarding the vetting of books:

- Book reconsideration.
- Only certified media specialists are permitted to vet books and certify or not certify books.
- The District Media Department has 2 certified media specialists and their supervisor.
- There are no district-certified media specialists in middle and high schools, the books are being vetted.
- Searching on sights and looking at internal catalog.
- They have taken recommendations from middle and high schools. They have a book guidance, so books that they would like to have a priority vetting have been taken into consideration.
- Prioritizing books and going through the review process with the team of certified media specialists.
- There has been one official challenge.
- Taken note of all the books mentioned during public comment and added them to the priority vetting list.
- Teams are already looking at them.
- Can use vetted approved sites to refer, but state training says the book must be read in its entirety.
- The books mentioned at the meeting will be pulled from the shelves and go through the district review vetting process.
- The 3 staff members will review the books as soon as possible.
- The books will not be in circulation.
