WHO WE PLAY FOR, LIFE-SAVING DONATION

This summer, Team Duval received an historic life-saving donation. The nonprofit "Who We Play For" donated portable electro-cardiogram machines also known as ECG units to all district high schools with athletic programs.

- These portable devices will allow athletic trainers to screen athletes for cardiac issues.
- According to the nonprofit, sudden cardiac arrest is the leading cause of student-athlete deaths.
- "Who We Play For" has the vision to inspire and empower schools, sports clubs, and communities to provide heart screenings for every student-athlete, and student, no matter their level of athletics, socio-economic status, or geographical location.
- "Who We Play For" Impact Director Shawn Sima says this:
 - *"We had twenty kids in the state of Florida that we know of who have experienced sudden cardiac arrest since October. I'm the father of a sudden cardiac arrest survivor. I'm a physician assistant. I've done sports medicine and orthopedics for 25 years. And until it happened to my family, I never truly understood the amount of sudden cardiac arrest victims we have every single year."*
- The purchase of these devices was made possible thanks to a \$100,000 donation the nonprofit received from Simply Healthcare earlier this year.
- Joining us this evening from "Who We Play For" is Impact Director Shawn Sima, and Executive Director Evan Ernst.
- We're also joined by our district Director of Athletics Tammy Talley and Supervisor of District Athletic Training Jerry Stevens.

MAYPORT MIDDLE SCHOOL INTERNATIONAL SEAPERCH COMPETITION CHAMPIONS

Not many schools can say they offer an internationally acclaimed robotics club specializing in underwater robotics! But that is the case for our next honoree – Mayport Coastal Sciences Middle School.

- The Mayport Sharks Robotics Club participated in the International SeaPerch Competition at the University of Maryland in June and won 10 awards against 175 teams from around the world. This includes:
 - Two Overall International Middle School Championships in Stock class (6th grade) & Open

- class (7th grade – which also included High School teams).
 - Eight additional Top 3 Category awards earned in competitive pool course events and in technical reports.
 - Speaking of technical reports, this year's winning report will be published in the scientific journal, *American Society of Naval Engineers*
- The Sharks have won numerous international awards at competitions designing and competing with underwater ROVs, or remotely operated vehicles.
- They build and test ROVs all school year, culminating in competitions where they have continually proven their success... winning over 50 trophies against teams from around the world.

- This led to a collaboration with THE PLAYERS Championship...who donated 450 ponchos to Kings Trail.
- Principal Santhette Shubert says this: "Mrs. Strada always goes above and beyond to support the students and families of Kings Trail; we are all extremely grateful for this gift to our students."

ERNEST HEMINGWAY AWARDEE: REYAANSH DESAI, JULIA LANDON COLLEGE PREPARATORY AND LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT SCHOOL

Team Duval is home to many remarkable students. And our final recognition highlights one of them. Reyaansh Desai of Julia Landon College Preparatory and Leadership Development School.

- Reyaansh was awarded the Ernest Hemingway Nobility Award at the Summer Debate Institute, or SDI, this summer.
- This award is given to students who judges believe exhibit this Hemingway quote: *“There is nothing noble in being superior to your fellow man; true nobility is being superior to your former self.”*
- At the SDI, students participate in wide-ranging discussions on important domestic and international topics, receive detailed feedback and insight, and compete in rigorous practice rounds.
- Reyaansh’s path to SDI began with his participation in the Incubate Debate program.
- He qualified for Incubate Debate’s national competition, earned a top award, and an offer from the University of Austin to cover the full cost of a four-year college tuition.
- This success ultimately led him to be automatically admitted to Summer Debate Institute (SDI) 2024.
- Principal Casey and his teacher Mr. Keith Smith have nothing but great things to say about Reyaansh, noting that he is a perfect representation of the young people learning and growing at Julia Landon.
- While the speech and debate program is a relatively new club for Landon, the school is excited to continue to see the success and development of students.
