Board Member Pearson spoke on behalf of proposed Policy 4.40(II) regarding parental consent for all school sponsored events. She reiterated a previous request made for staff to review if outside speakers are included in the cited rule. She inquired about support for including outside speakers, parties and celebrations in the district policy and allowing the Superintendent to handle the procedures. From a parental point of view, she is concerned about the need to sign more permission slips than necessary, and she is also concerned about inconsistencies across schools. She suggested pulling Policy 4.40 to allow the Superintendent time to address the issues through policy, thus working towards consistency for all schools.

Board Member Willie chimed in sharing that he agrees with Board Member Pearson and referenced the direction given from the State thus a motion to amend was made by Board Member Pearson to remove Policy 4.44 for further consideration and then approve the remaining Policy 4.
