33. CHARTER CONTRACT RENEWAL FOR SAN JOSE EARLY COLLEGE AT CECIL

Discussion:

Board Member Pearson expressed concern regarding the 5-year renewal and inquired about the Board having renewal options that were fewer than 5 years. Dr. Bernier shared the minimum provided via state statute. Eugene Hays, Director, Office of School Choice Pathways, joined in the discussion, sharing that state law does not provide the district with an option other than the 5-year option. However, a shorter-term renewal option was communicated with the CEO of the charter school, but they were not interested in that option.

Board Member Pearson inquired about the Board's options and, per Dr. Bernier, he shared that the Board can make any decision they choose and shared what could potentially take place.

Board Member Willie thanked Board Member Pearson for pulling the item and shared that in thinking about this issue there is a need to think about Schools of Hope. When reviewing the financial piece, when does the Board come back to review or have check points during the 5 years to make sure the charter school is on track or not? Dr. Bernier referenced Florida Statute 1002.345, Determination of deteriorating financial conditions and financial emergencies for charter schools and charter technical career centers, in which it speaks of the time for notifying the governing board. Board Member Willie inquired about the history of the board. Per Mr. Hays, the Board has never exercised their rights per law because, in the past, schools have volunteered to close if the condition of the school was not able to be turned around.

Mr. Spillias referred to the Fl. State Statute and the annual progress report.

An inquiry was made regarding the annual progress reports being received by the Board.

Vice-Chairman Carney inquired about conversations involving combining San Jose Early College at Cecil and San Jose Preparatory. Per Mr. Hays, the schools face an issue with the distance between the two. If the school closes, conversations have been held about student placement.

Board Member Willie shared feedback on things that transpired in the past, and those things had a negative impact. However, this situation could have a positive impact.
